62p-a-min calls to doc are axed

PREMIUM rate phone numbers at GP surgeries are being axed after the rip-off was exposed by the Sunday Mirror.

The Fair Telecoms Campaign complained after patients faced bills of up to £3.10 for a five minute call.

Now all but a handful of surgeries have abandoned the numbers. Practices were told seven years ago that calls should be charged at no more than the standard local rate.

But we revealed nearly 1,000 were still using the 084 numbers, with profits split between the surgery,
